





Increase Participation

- Make sure you do breakfast and lunch
- Don't just do June add July



2023 Breakdown











Avoyelles Parish School Board





Avoyelles Parish is a rural parish in central Louisiana

The student population within the 10 public schools is 5,000.

The district has been a CEP district for 10 years.

The ISP of the district is above 65%

The district operates on a four day school week and provides the students with a supper meal daily under the CACFP program.

Avoyelles Parish is rich in cajun culture and heritage but the poverty level is high.

Non-Congregate Meals in Avoyelles Parish



Avoyelles Parish distributed shelf stable food boxes since the summer of 2020

- Distribution occurred every Monday from 8:00 am to 1:00 pm at five locations across the district.
- The child had to be present or the parent had to present the parent pick up form in order to receive the food box.
- Last summer we distributed 7,000 boxes weekly.



Marketing the program

- Facebook
- Student all call weekly
- Local newspaper articles
- Radio stations
- Yard signs
- District website

Facebook post was shared many times. The community liked the product and made sure to remind family and friends of the upcoming "Food Box" day.

Pictures of items in the box were posted weekly and the community would comment on their excitement for the new items.

SUMMER FEEDING AND FOOD BOXES

APSB will provide free meals to children 18 and under this summer. Food boxes will be distributed on Mondays starting May 29th, 2023 through July 31st, 2023. All children 18 and under are eligible to receive the food box and if your child is not present at pickup, you may fill out a pickup form. Pick up forms will be located at each pickup location and on the APSB website.

Food boxes will be distributed at five locations:

Marksville Elementary Bunkie High Avoyelles High Lafargue Elementary Riverside Elementary

EVERY Monday starting May 29th, 2023 from 8:00 a.m. until 1:00 pm

On-site feeding will also occur daily and is open to all children 18 and under at the following locations:

LaSAS- June 6th-July 14th Tuesday-Friday Breakfast-8:00 Lunch 12:00 BELA June 6th – June 30th Tuesday-Friday Breakfast-8:00 Lunch 12:00 MES June 6th- June 30th Tuesday-Friday Breakfast-8:00 Lunch 12:00 CES June 5th – July 31st Monday-Thursday Breakfast-8:30 Lunch 12:30 RES June 6th – June 30th Tuesday-Friday Breakfast 8:00 Lunch 12:00

Finances

Food boxes were added to my 2023-24 SY Staple bid

The cost per box was ____\$33.13__; Price per meal was ___\$6.262__

Reimbursement per meal <u>\$7.77</u>

Total Profit <u>\$1.508</u> per day

Avoyelles served 576,800 meals last summer.

286,618 times \$1.508 =

Daily profit of \$434,907



Extra Cost

- The food boxes were delivered to the Child Nutrition Warehouse on Thursdays, in a temperature controlled warehouse.
- Pallets were loaded on trailers on Friday and stored in the CNW
- Monday the trailers were hauled to 5 locations across the parish
- We had 6-8 staff members per location to receive the Parent Pick Up form, one to check off the SFSP hash mark sheet and the rest to load the boxes into cars.
- We hire someone to help transport the trailers and rent trailers.
 - Extra charge of \$600.00 per week
 - o 10 weeks= \$6,000.00

Staffing



- APSD established a pay rate of \$25.00 per hour with ESSER funds for COVID related labor.
- This allowed the food box distribution pay rate to continue at \$25.00 per hour.
- Food Service staff and maintenance staff have eagerly signed up every year to work.
- Staff is paid for 6 hours every Monday.
- ESSER has covered labor but next year we plan to keep the rate and continue the program.
- 5 locations; 31 employees; 6 hours per day; 10 days during the summer
- 31 x 6=186 hours per day x \$25.00= \$4,650 X 10 days= \$46,500



Total Profit

- Food box profit of \$434,907.00
 - Labor cost \$46,500,00
 - Hauling and renting cost \$6,000.00
 - Total profit of \$382,407.00

We have proudly been able to self operate and feed the children of our parish all summer long for the past 4 years. We have been able to turn a profit that has lead to improvements of our school food service department which include a new Child Nutrition Programs Warehouse, new trucks for the program and numerous new equipment.


